



TIMELY FACTS ON THE QUEENS CLOCK TOWER...

Welcome back to Queens! We're happy to announce a construction project that will result in a new focal point for the back campus: the clock tower at Queens. Take a minute and learn more about it...

Architect: Jenkins-Peer Architects, the firm that planned Trexler Center, designed the tower to be consistent with the College's traditional architectural style. Patterned after classic clock and bell towers, including one in Venice, Queens' tower will be constructed of red brick with a clock face on all four sides.

Location: the tower will be built on the sidewalk near the campus police building. If you'd like to get away to a quiet, shady place, the Chi Omega gazebo is now located near the chapel.

Construction Schedule: a temporary pole has been erected but will be taken down when construction is completed. The project will start in early September and end by December 31.

Purpose: the 132-foot tower will house service antennas for BellSouth and Alltel Mobile to enhance their cellular phone service delivery in the Myers Park area. Queens will own the structure, but the companies will pay for *all* construction costs and will lease the tower space for up to 20 years. Revenue will be added to the general budget for the College. BellSouth and Alltel also made a donation that will be used to support campus technology.

Landscaping Plans: additional landscaping will be developed on the back campus to create more green space in the area. Look for news on these projects in the next few weeks.
